Q & R Spectre Study

1. How long will the study last?

The total duration of the study will be approximately twelve (12) months. Your personal participation will be for a minimum of four (4) weeks from randomization, but may be longer if your visits are more than one week apart.

2. When will I receive my compensation?

You will receive compensation for expenses incurred as a result of your participation in the research project at the end of each completed visit. Your compensation will be proportional to the length of your participation. Payment is made by Interac transfer and may take 4 to 5 business days to be received.

3. If I have never used CBD by inhalation, but have smoked THC and/or eaten cannabis in the last 30 days, can I participate in the study?

Yes, any form of cannabis consumption in the last 30 days can make you a candidate for our study.

4. Where will the study take place?

The study will take place at the CHUM Research Centre, located at 900 rue St-Denis in Montreal. The research center is right next to the Champ-de-Mars metro station and is accessible by several bus routes.

5. Will my answers to the questionnaires be confidential?

Yes, all your answers are confidential and anonymous.

6. Can I drive my car after the visit?

No. It is important to go to the study visits by public transportation or to make sure that you have someone to drive you back since you will have consumed the research product.

7. How long do the visits last?

The first visit, to determine eligibility, last approximately three (3) to four (4) hours. The next five visits, to inhale the research product, last approximately five (5) hours.

8. What doses of CBD and THC does the research product contain?

You will inhale one of the following amounts of CBD and THC, which will be different for each visit.

- 0 mg CBD 20 mg THC
- 20 mg CBD 20 mg THC
- 40 mg CBD 20 mg THC
- 80 mg CBD 20 mg THC
- 120 mg CBD 20 mg THC

9. What will I have to do?

During your eligibility visit, you'll have to answer questionnaires and take tests such as blood tests, electrocardiograms and pregnancy tests. For inhalation visits, you'll have to answer questionnaires and take various tests, including blood tests and a urine test.
